The funding will target aspects of essential resourcing, professional learning experiences that yield high performing teaching practices. The funds will be used to improve student engagement rate in learning by:

- Developing assessment literate learners through the implementation of 100% of students reviewed with the inquiry cycle, twice per term (5-week data cycle).
- Increasing the percentage of Prep to Year 6 students from 86% in 2019 to 100% of Year 1 to Year 6 students to achieve an A-C level of achievement in English by the middle of 2020.
- Increasing the percentage of students achieving an A-B level of achievement to 100% in English by the end of 2020.

#### Our initiatives include

- Develop staff capability in data analysis to inform teaching and learning. Implement an Explicit Improvement Agenda with a sharp and narrow focus in writing.
- Implement individual learning goals for all students in writing.
- Implement whole school process for monitoring student achievement of goals.
- Collaboratively support staff implementing an inquiry cycle approach in English.
- Utilising the Literacy continuum/Early Start materials across Year 1 to Year 6, to identify students' skills and knowledge to track progress and focus on the next steps for teaching/learning.
- Implement Early Years daily Phonemic Awareness (Heggerty), daily sounds/Alphabet cards and daily Writing (One sentence at a time: Hodman and Wexler)





### Our school will improve student outcomes by

- Release teaching staff to engage in building capacity when engaging with the inquiry cycles, data analysis and goal setting. \$1200
- Upskilling staff to explore student evidence as a vehicle for pedagogical excellence and high quality moderation practices. \$1000
- Professional learning release time for teachers to work collaboratively to co-plan, coteach, co-assess and co-reflect, observe peer practices and collaborate on high yield practice. \$3296
